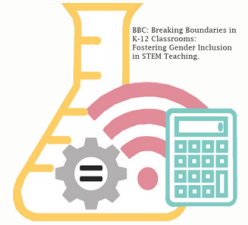




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BBC: BREAKING BOUNDARIES IN K-12 CLASSROOMS: FOSTERING GENDER INCLUSION IN STEM TEACHING
